Resident Unveils the VentPendant by Daniel Schofield

Resident is pleased to introduce the Vent Pendant, a new lighting collection by Daniel Schofield. This marks Schofield's first design for Resident, expanding the studio's established portfolio of considered lighting. Crafted in cast aluminium or bronze, the pendant brings together two intersecting forms: a cone and a triangle. Together, they direct light in both focused and ambient directions, resulting in a sculptural object that balances utility with raw material expression.

The Vent Pendant is made using the traditional process of sand casting — a technique Resident has become known for. This method allows for rich surface textures and subtle inconsistencies, bringing a sense of tactility and depth to each piece.

Based in Copenhagen and originally from the United Kingdom, Schofield's practice spans furniture, lighting and product design. With a background in both graphic design and carpentry, his work is guided by function, simplicity, and a sensitivity to material. He has collaborated with leading international studios, received awards including Northern Designer of the Year and the Elle Decoration British Design Award, and began his career under the mentorship of Sir Terence Conran.

Quote from the designer

"When designing light, I'm always thinking about how the object interacts with the light itself. I wanted to create both focused and ambient light, so I figured out that by combining a cone and a triangle, I could let the light escape in two directions. That simple form, combined with cast aluminium, lets the diffuse light interact with the material, giving it an extra layer of depth."

The Vent Pendant can hang solo or be arranged in multiples. Its compact scale and understated presence make it a flexible option for residential and commercial spaces.
